3. Any other business

- a. Storage containers- emailed Foundation Scotland and had no response from them.

5. Any other business

- a. Thrumster update: Thrumster Community Development Association is in the process of taking over the playpark and has secured funding for renovating the tennis courts.
 Someone drove a van through the playpark in Thrumster, there is video evidence. Action Email PC Thain on this issue.
- b. Policing update: In the period since last meeting there had been 3 calls in the Tannach and District CC area. In the entire Caithness area there was 448 incidents raised during the same time period. 1 was in relation to an oil spill on the road, which was passed to Highland Council. 1 was a pocket/accidental dial, 1 was to report a fraud. Recruitment: Our rural recruitment campaign is ongoing, looking for applications from people who want to work in Caithness. Police Scotland is recruiting police officers in Caithness, and encouraging applications from people who share their values, and are either starting out on their career journey or considering a career change. We are looking for recruits of all ages and backgrounds, but you do have to be aged 18 or over (you can apply at 17.5), physically fit, and hold a valid driving licence. As a police officer working in a rural community, you will often be the first responder to incidents and will quickly see how your actions can help people at their time of need.

- f. Flowers for villages: £150 awarded each to Haster, Milton and Thrumster as a grant from CC money (£450 total). All voted in favour.
