- d. Police report from PC Thain read out by Holly Forbes in his absence: Since last meeting there has been 4 calls to police in the TDCC area. This included 1 domestic incident, 1 communication offence, 1 RTC, 1 road traffic matter. Not included in this is a large number of "dropped 999" calls. These are pocket dials or accidental calls, which are disconnected prior to police being able to speak with the caller. There has been a huge rise in these type calls across the country, many of which are linked to a recent update to Android phones which places a call to emergency services when certain buttons are pressed. There have been social media posts put onto the Highland and Islands Division Facebook page with more information. Proactive patrols have also been carried out by local and Roads Policing Officers resulting in drivers being reported for offences such as speeding (94mph in 60mph zone) and

seatbelt offences. The Scottish Police Authority are continuing their Community Confidence Action Research project, which previously saw an online survey being completed by a number of people in Caithness. The SPA are holding an event at PPP, Huddart Street, Wick on Wednesday 12th July 0930-1200. The event is an opportunity for the community to help shape policing in the area. Although the project is primarily focussed on Wick, it will likely affect the wider Caithness community.
